### **INSTITUTION PROFILE**

The RMAH is a bilingual (French/Dutch) scientific research institute that operates under the Federal Belgian Science Policy. It has the responsibility over five museums in Brussels with following missions (among others):

- Scientific research
- Conservation and restoration of museum collections
- Management and publication of collections through the development of:
  - a central database (MuseumPlus)
  - a collection publishing portal (Carmentis www.carmentis.be)
  - metadata schemes and object descriptions (by using standards)
  - a data aggregator environment
  - a network of expertise in technological and content-based aspects of digitization

RMAH collections include: Antiquity, Pre-Columbian Americas, Ancient Near East, China, Japan, Oceania, National Archaeology, Islamic etc.; Art Nouveau, Art Déco, ceramics, silverware, costume and lace, arms and armor, carriages etc.; photographs; musical instruments

# BIOGRAPHY AND ROLE IN THE PROJECT

- Eva Coudyzer graduated with a master degree in Art History and Archaeology at the Free University of Brussels (VUB). Since 2009 she has been employed by the Royal Museums of Art and History (RMAH) as a thesaurus development manager. She worked on metadata, multilingual terminologies and object descriptions. She is also coordinator of the project Multilingual terminological research (French, Dutch and English) for the development and integration of semantically enriched scientific thesauri (MULTITA), funded by the Federal Belgian Science Policy.
